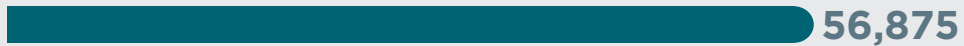

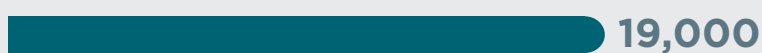

RADNYK PROGRAMME MONTHLY REPORT IN FEBRUARY 2020

The Project *Development of social cohesion in Ukraine through strengthened regional and local social protection of IDPs, veterans, and other conflict affected persons* (or the Radnyk Programme) is implemented by organization *Stabilization Support Services* with the financial support of the British Embassy Kyiv.

- Radnyks provided methodological support consultations on social protection of vulnerable population to 560 specialists of the social protection system and 127 non-governmental organizations (NGOs) representatives.
- 411 IDPs were provided with consultations on social protection issues (out of them, 75% - women; 26% - elderly people; 3% - children; 8% - people with disabilities; 8% - ATO participants) by Radnyks.
- In February regional legal officers in Houses of Veterans provided consultations for 29 persons (out of them, 3% - women, 100% - combatants).
- During the reporting period, Radnyks in 20 operational oblasts of Ukraine finalized and submitted 64 social profiles of ATCs, 63 methodological recommendations on social services provision in ATCs, and developed 31 draft strategic plans for communities development.
- In February a series of meetings was conducted with the coalition of partner organizations including *CF Right to Protection*, *Human Rights Information Centre (ZMINA)*, *NGO Donbas SOS*, *NGO Civil Holding "Group of Influence"*, and UNHCR to discuss the advocacy strategy on the draft law No.2083-d on pension rights.
- On February 17, the coalition of partner organizations presented a shadow report on Ukraine's implementation of the International Covenant on Social, Economic and Cultural Rights. The report was developed by SSS lawyer and the representatives of *NGO Donbas SOS*, *CO CF CrimeaSOS*, *CF Right to Protection*, *CO CF Vostok-SOS*, *NGO Civil Holding "Group of Influence"*, *Human Rights Information Centre (ZMINA)*, *NGO Crimean Human Rights Group*. The report highlights violation of rights of conflict-affected persons and key problems these people face as well as recommendations for Ukraine. The shadow report was already submitted to the UN Human Rights Committee.

- On February 25, the final press-conference *Houses of Veterans: From Pilot Project to National Strategy* took place in Odesa. The Minister for Veterans Affairs, Temporarily Occupied Territories and Internally Displaced Persons, the Counsellor and Head of Ukraine Programmes of the British Embassy Kyiv, representatives of government bodies, educational institutions, public organizations and regional project coordinators participated in the event. Representatives of the Houses of Veterans reported on their main achievements during the project implementation.
- With the support of the Radnyk Programme, CF *Right to Protection*, and Beetroot Academy Kyiv, informational leaflets on *Legal Advisor for IDPs*, a Facebook chatbot providing conflict-affected persons with 24/7 free legal aid, were placed on the checkpoints, including Maiorske.
