## RADNYK PROGRAMME MONTHLY REPORT IN JANUARY 2020

The Project *Development of social cohesion in Ukraine through strengthened regional and local social protection of IDPs, veterans, and other conflict affected persons* (or the Radnyk Programme) is implemented by organization *Stabilization Support Services* with the financial support of the British Embassy Kyiv.

- Radnyks provided methodological support consultations on social protection of vulnerable population to 640 specialists of the social protection system and 114 non-governmental organizations (NGOs) representatives.
- 378 IDPs were provided with consultations on social protection issues (out of them, 77% - women; 22% - elderly people; 3% - children; 6% - people with disabilities; 7% - ATO participants; 1% - representatives of national minorities) by Radnyks.
- In January regional legal officers in Houses of Veterans provided consultations for 35 persons (out of them, 14% - women, 6% - elderly people, 94% - combatants, 6% - people with disabilities). 82 people received psychological consultations (out of them 39% - women, 6% - elderly people, 2% - children, 65% - combatants, 10% - people with disabilities).
- The Programme established cooperation with the Ministry for Communities and Territories Development. The Programme representative joined a new working group on gender equality under the auspices of the Ministry. The working group operates within the Donor Board on Decentralization Reform in Ukraine.
- On January 14-17, an art exhibition *Healing by creativity* took place at the premises of the Verkhovna Rada of Ukraine. The exhibition featured 25 paintings of ATO/JFO veterans participating in the art therapy sessions as part of their rehabilitation and reintegration programming at the Rivne Regional Hospital for the Veterans of War. The art exhibition was held to celebrate Human Rights Day in cooperation with the Committee on Social Policy and Protection of Veterans' Rights of the Verkhovna Rada. The attendees included representatives of various VRU Committees.

- Methodological recommendations on the creation and functioning of the Houses of Veterans was developed within the Programme activities and approved by the order of the Ministry for Veterans Affairs, Temporarily Occupied Territories and Internally Displaced Persons dated January 15. The recommendations aim at implementing effective ways for rehabilitation and psychosocial adaptation of ATO/JFO veterans.
- On January 21, a Memorandum on Cooperation was signed between the Radnyk Programme, CF Right to Protection, Beetroot Academy Kyiv and initiative group (the winners of the Hackathon on Social Cohesion) on implementing a project *Legal Advisor for IDPs*. The Facebook chatbot was developed to provide conflict-affected people with 24/7 “borderless” access to free legal aid.
- On January 27-28, the Programme conducted a strategic session for the Ministry for Veterans Affairs. The Minister for Veterans Affairs, the First Deputy Minister, Deputy Ministers, as well as advisers to the Minister joined the meeting. Participants identified key strategic directions for planning and implementing activities aimed at key beneficiaries of the Ministry, in particular veterans, IDPs and residents of the temporary occupied territories.
- New information stands was installed at checkpoints Maiorsk and Marinka (Donetsk oblast) with the support of Deputy Head of the Department of Information and Internal Policy of the Donetsk RSA. Stands display important information on the rights and opportunities of IDPs and other residents of the “grey zone”.
